NOONGAR LULLABIES FROM NORTHAM

Kwobidak Balladong Boodja is a compilation of original lullabies that capture the koort, moort and kalyakool (heart, family and legacy) of Noongar families in Northam, in the Avon Valley of Western Australia.

Under the gentle guidance of award-winning artists Phil Bartlett and Cyndy Moody, Noongar community members came together to share Noongar language and learn songwriting techniques.

Once everyone had crafted their songs, participants recorded their lullabies in a pop-up studio at Northam Primary School, with additional musical production by the Lullabies team - Cyndy, Phil and Sean Lillico.

Lullabies is produced by Community Arts Network in collaboration with Noongar families and is supported through the Australian Government's Indigenous Languages and Arts program.

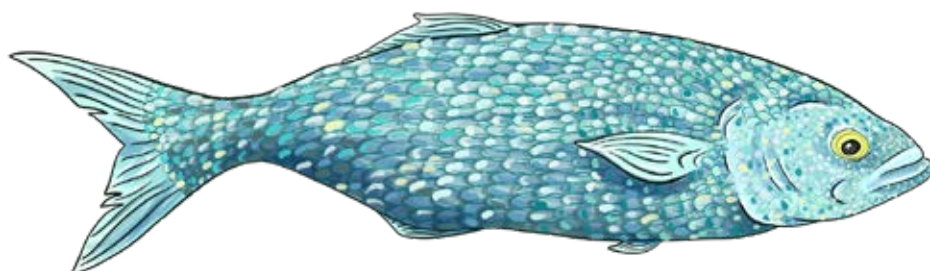

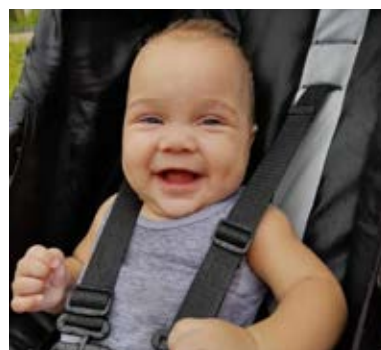

It is important that our songs, paintings, dances, and language is passed down to the next generation for all to enjoy and to be proud of their culture/identity, so they can continue to practise the oldest living culture in the world.

I now sing this lullaby to all my grannies and teach language for them to learn. This project has been a great opportunity and fun to do. I hope everybody enjoys all the lullabies as much as I enjoyed recording it.

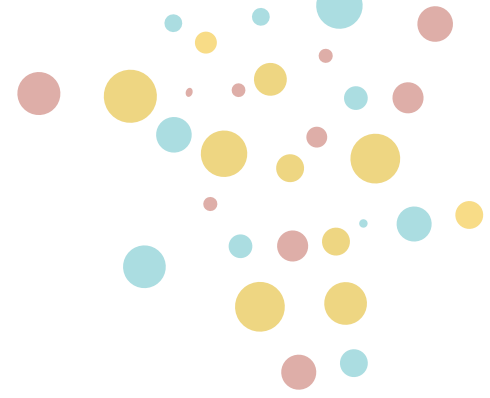

Phil started working on CAN's Lullabies program in 2019 and has brought with him incredible musicianship and mentoring skills.

"What we're doing through Lullabies is marrying music, culture with language. It's such a powerful thing and it's working."

"It's helping change lives, it's helping people connect with who they are, and it's also helping people to become strong and confident again. My hope for the project is it keeps going... for 10 years, 20 years, so that we can enable more and more people to speak beautiful Noongar language."

CYNDY MOODY

Cyndy Moody is a Noongar language speaker and singer / songwriter sharing language and music straight from the heart. A former project participant, Cyndy joined the Lullabies team in 2022 as a language facilitator in her hometown of Northam.

In 2021 Cyndy and Phil won a WAM Song of the Year award for Cyndy's song Ngany Koorlangka (My Kid).

"It's been great being a part of Lullabies. I love teaching language and seeing the confidence in people as they connect to language and sing songs from their heart. As Noongar people, language is important to us and it's wonderful helping people find that connection from within themselves."

"The experience of teaching and sharing language is very special and important to me because I want to share something I have, to help empower people and lift them up spirituality, mentally and emotionally. Language connects us as Aboriginal people and Lullabies is giving everyone an opportunity to be part of a legacy for generations to come."
