Lullabies Kwinana is the ninth iteration of Community Arts Network's award-winning Noongar Lullabies project, a language, music and art program designed to support the revival of the critically endangered language of the Noongar people, the First People of South Western Australia.

Led by Kobi Arthur Morrison and Cyndy Moody, in partnership with the Moorditj Kulungar Playgroup and the City of Kwinana, this project engaged young children (0–4 years) and their families and carers.

This special collaboration culminated in the joyful song featured in this book, *Moorditj Kulungar*, which celebrates culture, connection and early language learning.
